**THE COLLEGE OF LAW.**—The College of Law opened its session of 1925-1926 with a registration of 136, or an increase of 17 over that of the preceding year. Only 5 students are registered as special students, all the others having completed the prescribed pre-legal college study necessary for the degree of Bachelor of Laws. Although this year's registration was the last in which special students could be admitted, only a few applications for such admission were received, which seems to prove that the new standard for admission to the bar, announced by the Supreme Court of Appeals to take effect in 1928, is accepted by all those interested in the matter, as a proper minimum standard of preparation for the practice of law.
